

These are parishes that have closed, but the dates of when they did so, is uncertain. Information that we have included is just an excerpt of history that we have found.

Andover All Saints

ANDOVER (Day County) All Saints

Andover in 1901 continued as a mission of Webster, but by 1904 the number of Catholic families had dwindled to 10.....Father Charles Sass cared for Andover from Bristol (1904-11).....In 1898 Andover constructed a parish house in the hope that such action would bring a priest. Catholics of the town were attended as early as 1883 from Milbank by Father John Hermeling. When in 1884 Webster received Father Francis Flanigan as pastor, he reported there were 60 families in Andover, enough to support a priest. Since Bishop Marty had no priest to send, he entrusted their care to Father Henry Mensing who in the meantime had become pastor at Webster. He directed the construction of All Saints Church in 1900.

For unknown reasons the number of Catholics declined in Andover so that when Father M. S. Kane became resident pastor in 1901, he found only 10 Catholic families. After 1904 Andover was a mission of Bristol. However, during the summer of 1910 Father E. Loftus came from Britton to minister to All Saints Parish. He built a rectory which was occupied in November by Father A. F. Amirault. The number of families had climbed to 50. The priest found Dutch, French and Polish people among his parishioners. Since he shared his time with the missions of Groton and Lily (1912-14) and Britton and Langford (1914-19), he could hold Sunday services only three times a month at All Saints Church.....In 1938 a tornado leveled the church built in 1900. A vacant building at Mina, 15 miles west of Aberdeen, was put on wheels and hauled approximately 50 miles to Andover. There it was remodeled and served for more than 30 years. The parish profited from the leadership of Father Thomas J. Shanley from 1926 to 1938. (CD)

Lily St. Joseph

Lily (Day County) St. Joseph

Lily, 12 miles from Bristol, was a mission of St. Otto's of Webster...Bristol and Lily were a team for over 60 years. In 1953 Father Louis Nally improved St. Joseph's Church by adding a sacristy, vestibule and converting the basement into a social center. Father Robert Spethman had a rectory built in 1966, the basement of which provided space for CCD classes. An adult education program got underway during Father Robert J. Fox's pastorate (1961-65). The 50 Catholic households were served by the pastor of Bristol. (CD)
