

Statement from The Most Reverend Paul J. Swain Bishop of Sioux Falls February 11, 2013 On the Announced Resignation of Pope Benedict XVI

It is with sadness yet with gratitude that I acknowledge the decision by His Holiness, Pope Benedict XVI, to resign from office. The Holy Spirit, who guided his election in 2005, surely has guided his decision now, and will guide the election of his successor.

A teacher at heart, Pope Benedict XVI has, through written and spoken word, but especially by faithful witness, taught us to contemplate the higher things and to defend truth. He has always done so with integrity, humility and a special love for those most vulnerable.
